What is SkillsFuture Credit?

SkillsFuture Credit aims to encourage individual ownership of skills development and lifelong learning. All Singaporeans aged 25 and above will receive an opening credit of S\$500 from January 2016. Your credit will not expire and the government will provide periodic top-ups, so you may accumulate your credit.


How to view my SkillsFuture Credit account?

What can I use my SkillsFuture Credit for?

Your SkillsFuture Credit can be used on top of existing government course subsidies to pay for a wide range of approved skills-related courses:



Upgrade and keep your skills relevant


Lifelong learning and continual skills upgrade will keep you relevant in today's dynamic workforce.

Step 1: Explore courses

How do I find an approved course?


Go to www.skillsfuture.sg/credit, enter your course title and click on to begin your search.
 If you do not have a course title in mind, click on to proceed.



You will be redirected to the SkillsFuture Credit Course Directory,
If you have entered a course title on the previous page, the Course Title field
will be populated.

You may enter more information to update your course search by:

- Courses Starting From (to search for courses from the entered date and onwards)
- Area of Training
- Course Title
- Training Provider



3. After you have reviewed and selected the course that you would like to attend, please register for the course directly with the training provider before applying to use your credit.


Step 2: Apply to use my credit

You can apply to use your credit from 30 days before the course start date, and up to 90 days after the course start date. Before logging in to your account, you will need to have your SingPass ID, password, name of training provider, course title and course start date.

PLEASE NOTE:


You will need to register directly with the training provider to enrol for the course. Applying to use your credit does **NOT** register you for the course.

- Log in to your account at www.skillsfuture.sg/credit with your SingPass.
- (!) If you need help with your SingPass, please visit www.singpass.gov.sg.
- 2. Click on Submit a claim
- 3. If this is your first time applying to use your credit, please update your information including your bank account details under My Profile.
- 4. On the claim submission page, click on + Select A Course
- 5. Fill in your Course Start Date. You may also fill in your Course Title and/or Training Provider to refine your search results.



Step 2: Apply to use my credit (continued)

6. Select the course from the search results.



7. Enter your payment details.

Example:

You would like to use your credit to pay for your course, which costs \$\$300 (inclusive of GST).



If you have already paid the training provider, you should select 'Pay to: My Bank Account' instead.

If you are submitting your claim after your course start date, you can only select 'Pay to: My Bank Account'.

(!) You may be asked to upload supporting documents for audit checks.

Step 2: Apply to use my credit (continued)


- 8. Accept the declaration to complete your submission.
- 9. You will see the following confirmation that your submission has been received.



Your submission will be processed within one working day.

How do I view my claim status and history?

- Log in to your account at www.skillsfuture.sg/credit with your SingPass.
- 2. You will be able to view your claim status and history.



Step 2: Apply to use my credit (continued)

How do I cancel my claim?

You can only cancel your claim before the course start date.

- 1. Under Claim Applications, click on Select Action ▼
- 2. Select Cancel Claim
- 3. Select a cancellation reason from the drop-down list.
- 4. You will see the following confirmation that your claim cancellation has been received.



Step 3: Learn and gain lifelong skills mastery

You are all set to attend the course. Through lifelong learning, you can deepen and master skills that will give you more opportunities to fulfil your potential in life.



Meng Soon, logistics technician

With a solid basic knowledge of coding and programming languages, he is keen to progress up the career ladder in information technology by deepening his technical skills to cover emerging areas such as Big Data and Analytics.

To pursue his goal, Jonathan is using his SkillsFuture Credit to sign up for relevant courses.

Aruna, former finance manager

"With SkillsFuture Credit, I CAN learn and contribute back." Aruna is a former finance manager. She wants to continue to stay active in society and to impart her years of experience and expertise in financial management. She wants to pursue a role in teaching.

She intends to improve her soft skills and her knowledge on curriculum design so as to deliver meaningful lessons to students.

Aruna wants to use her SkillsFuture Credit to attend courses on communication skills and curriculum development.

Rohani, homemaker

"With SkillsFuture Credit, I CAN upgrade my skills to remain relevant." Rohani has been a homemaker for several years. Now that her children are older, she wishes to return to work. She likes to help those in need and wants to return to her previous job as a nurse.

She wants to refresh and update her clinical skills in the healthcare industry, so she speaks with some former colleagues on current job requirements.

She wants to use her SkillsFuture Credit to take up a course for returning nurses.



Frequently asked questions (FAQ)

1. Is the SkillsFuture Credit a cash account?

SkillsFuture Credit is not a cash account, and will not earn any interest. The credit can be used to pay for out-of-pocket course fees for attending approved courses. You cannot withdraw cash from this account to pay your training provider as the transactions will be made directly through the SkillsFuture Credit Portal.

2. Is S\$500 in credit enough to cover my training costs?

Many skills-related courses are already highly subsidised by the government to ensure that training costs are affordable. The credit can be used on top of existing course fee subsidies provided by the government. The government will make periodic top-ups to Singaporeans' SkillsFuture Credit accounts.

3. Why is SkillsFuture Credit only available to Singaporeans aged 25 and above?

SkillsFuture Credit is for Singaporeans who have already completed their full-time education and are ready to start their careers, or who are already in the workforce. It allows them to invest in their continual learning journey.

4. Can I transfer my credit to my family members or friends?

The credit is non-transferable.

5. Can my employer tap on my SkillsFuture Credit?

No. SkillsFuture Credit supports individual-initiated training. It is not intended to pay for job-related training provided by your employer, which should continue to be borne by your employer. Many skills-related courses are already highly subsidised by the government.

6. Do I have to use my SkillsFuture Credit now?

The credit does not expire. You can use it now or later. You can also accumulate your credit when periodic top-ups are made.

7. If my training provider cancels the course, can I get a refund of the credit that I have used to pay for the course?

You should cancel your claim submission by logging in to your SkillsFuture Credit account at www.skillsfuture.sg/credit before the course start date and WDA will return the credit to your SkillsFuture Credit account. If you encounter technical problems cancelling your claim submission, please contact the SkillsFuture Hotline for further assistance.

8. Can I use my SkillsFuture Credit to pay for a course which I have already attended?

Yes. However, you can only submit a claim for courses that start from 1st January 2016 and onwards.
